

# IPT – INTERNATIONAL CIVILIAN PEACEBUILDING TRAINING PROGRAMME

## MORE COURSE INFORMATION

### Conditions of Participation

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Applicants should be motivated and willing or already engaged in peacebuilding activities in crisis regions.

Ideally, Core Courses are being attended before Specialisation Courses and Master Classes. With sufficient practical or theoretical experience, however, this can be waived on a case-to-case basis.

To date, all IPT-courses are being conducted in English. Thus, applicants must have good command of English.

Applicants have to be in good state of physical and mental health. This is not only necessary for later deployment, but also for some of the outdoor activities.

Taking into account recruitment standards of international organisations, participants should:

- be aged preferably between 25-60
- have expertise and relevant work experience in their respective areas of professional competence
- have at least a first level university degree or equivalent professional experience
- be able and willing to work in a team and within a multicultural environment
- have a valid driving licence
- be computer literate

### Scholarships

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With support of Austrian ministries, companies and private donors, the ASPR is able to award a limited number of scholarships to outstanding candidates. Eligible are qualified applicants from countries according to the DAC List of ODA Recipients.

To apply for support, applicants have to indicate this in the relevant section of the application form. Scholarships may be awarded fully or partially.

After the application deadline, the admissions board will screen all applications and decide about the allocation of scholarships. Applicants working in civil society organisations and representing minority groups will be prioritised. The outcome of the scholarship application will be communicated in the letter of invitation.

Scholarship-applications beyond the deadline of application cannot be considered.

### Certificate

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Successful participants are rewarded with a certificate at the end of the residential course phase. Participants of Core Courses will receive an ENTRI-certified certificate allowing for applications as EU-mission personnel.
