## CORE TRAINERS

**Augustin Nicolescou** is Senior Expert at the Austrian Study Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution. His work focuses on the development and implementation of dialogue and conflict transformation initiatives, including in the Middle-East, Ukraine, South Caucasus, and Sudan. He is also the Co-Director of the Herbert C. Kelman Institute for Interactive Conflict Transformation. At Crisis Management Initiative's Brussels office, he worked on CMI's efforts to support the development of mediation policies in regional organizations, in particular ASEAN and the EU. He delivers trainings and consults on conflict transformation, dialogue, and conflict sensitivity in development initiatives. He graduated from McGill University, with a B.A. in Political Science, and also holds a M.A. in Peace and Conflict Studies from the European University Centre for Peace Studies in Austria.

**Denis Matveev** is a dialogue facilitator, adviser and educator with more than 15 years experience in the fields of political dialogue and conflict transformation. Denis has designed and taught Masters courses at the ETH Zurich, University of Basel and the European University Centre for Peace Studies (Austria) and professional development courses at the Swiss Peace Foundation, Folke Bernadotte Academy (Sweden), forumZFD Academy for Conflict Transformation (Germany), Geneva Centre for Security Policy, Ahrim Canadian University (Egypt) and PATRIR-IPDTC (Romania) as well as providing training, coaching and consultancy on dialogue, mediation and conflict analysis to the OSCE, EEAS, UN DPA, UNDP, World Bank and Commonwealth Secretariat. Denis holds an M.A. in Peace and Conflict Studies from the European University Centre for Peace Studies in Austria and a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Melbourne, Australia.
