

# Partners and Trainers – Senior Level Course on Recovery and Stabilisation Strategies

## General Background



This course was developed in 2009 on the initiative of the ASPR in cooperation with Austrian MOD and was first called Peacebuilding Course. Over the years, the course was completely reviewed and reshaped to target senior level participants and be more relevant to CSDP missions. It thereby considered a couple of shortfalls in strategic planning for recovery and stabilisation which were identified by the ongoing reviews of the CSDP missions. Addressing to senior participants, the course is focusing more on comparison of policies and planning experiences than upfront lecturing and includes interactive methodologies such as panels and debates as well as case studies.

The following expertise is brought into the course:

### 1. Austrian Defence Academy



The Austrian Defence Academy being one of the key implementation partners of the MOD for higher level ESDC Courses assists the ASPR with the organisation of this course and contributes to bring several international senior experts to the course.

**Ms Sandra Kick** has studied Political Science and Journalism in Vienna und Paris and has thereafter from 1995 to 1999 been a staff member "United Nations Association of Austria", as well as editor of "Optic Couture" and "Global View". She joined the Austrian Ministry of Defence and Sports in 1999 and works at the Austrian National Defence Academy until 2000 and joined the Office of Security Policy from 2001 to 2005. After that she has been organising and managing several high-level training events, such as conferences on "International Security and the Fight against Terrorism" in 2002 and "Mediterranean Security, Stability and Cooperation" in 2003. Since 2004, Sandra has managing many Strategic Leadership Courses as the deputy project manager and is in charge of a variety of senior level ESDC courses in Austria and abroad.

### 2. ASPR



The ASPR has since the initiation of the course strived to bring in its expertise regarding the long term perspective of peacebuilding that is needed after a short term intervention such as a peace support operation and accordingly contributed its subject matter expertise in all fields of expertise, focusing more on conflict resolution and development issues, assisting the post-conflict recovery process.

Susanne J. Brezina joined the Austrian Study Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution (ASPR) in March 2015 to manage the cooperation programme between the ASPR and the Austrian Ministry of Defence. Previously, Susanne worked and lived for 20 years in East Africa (Rwanda and Kenya) where she has been employed with Caritas Austria, the ICRC, UNDP, MONUC and has specialized in Programme Management with a focus on DDR and SSR, Post-Conflict Recovery and Peacebuilding. Building on her practical experience, she engaged in the design and conduct of Training Programmes in her subject matter expertise and worked as a trainer with the Pearson Peacekeeping Centre Canada and the Folke Bernadotte Academy of Sweden, the

International Peace Support Training Centre (IPSTC) in Nairobi, Kenya and many other international partners. Susanne holds a Master's Degree from the University of Zurich and the Teacher Training College Zurich, Switzerland. She brings her long term experience working in post-conflict contexts to the course.
